## New 2023 ID Cards & Outlines of Coverage Coming Soon

Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Vermont will be mailing out two important documents:

- All members will receive a new ID card, with an effective date of January 1, 2023. The new ID cards may have updated, cost-sharing information. ID numbers and group numbers, however, are <u>not</u> changing, unless an employee made a plan change during open enrollment this year. Members can expect to receive their new ID cards over the next 10-12 business days.
- 2. **Outlines of Coverage** will come in a separate mailing and will be mailed once Benefit Description Documents (BDDs) are approved by the Vermont Department of Financial Regulation (DFR).

Question: Can I still use my 2022 ID card on or after January 1, 2023, if necessary?

**Answer:** Yes, your 2022 ID card is still valid and can be used <u>until your new 2023 ID card is</u> received. When you receive your new ID card, dispose of the old one properly to protect your member information, and remember to keep your new ID card in a safe and secure place. (ID cards are **date stamped** on the back, so you can easily identify the latest version.)

## Mail-Order Prescriptions: Co-Payment Modification for Platinum and Gold [Non-CDHP] Plans

Due to a Vermont mandate, VEHI members in the Platinum and Gold [**non-CDHP**] Plans will now be charged the same number of copayments for prescriptions via mail-order as for the same prescriptions purchased at retail pharmacies.

This means starting January 1, 2023, those who utilize a mail-order pharmacy for a 90-day supply of their medication will be subject to **3 copayments**, rather than the **previous 2 copayments** for a 90-day supply. This change affects less than 60 of VEHI's approximately 34,500 members. If you are affected, you will be contacted directly by Vermont Blue Rx.
